Garden food web



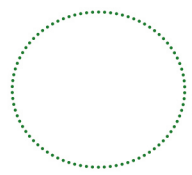
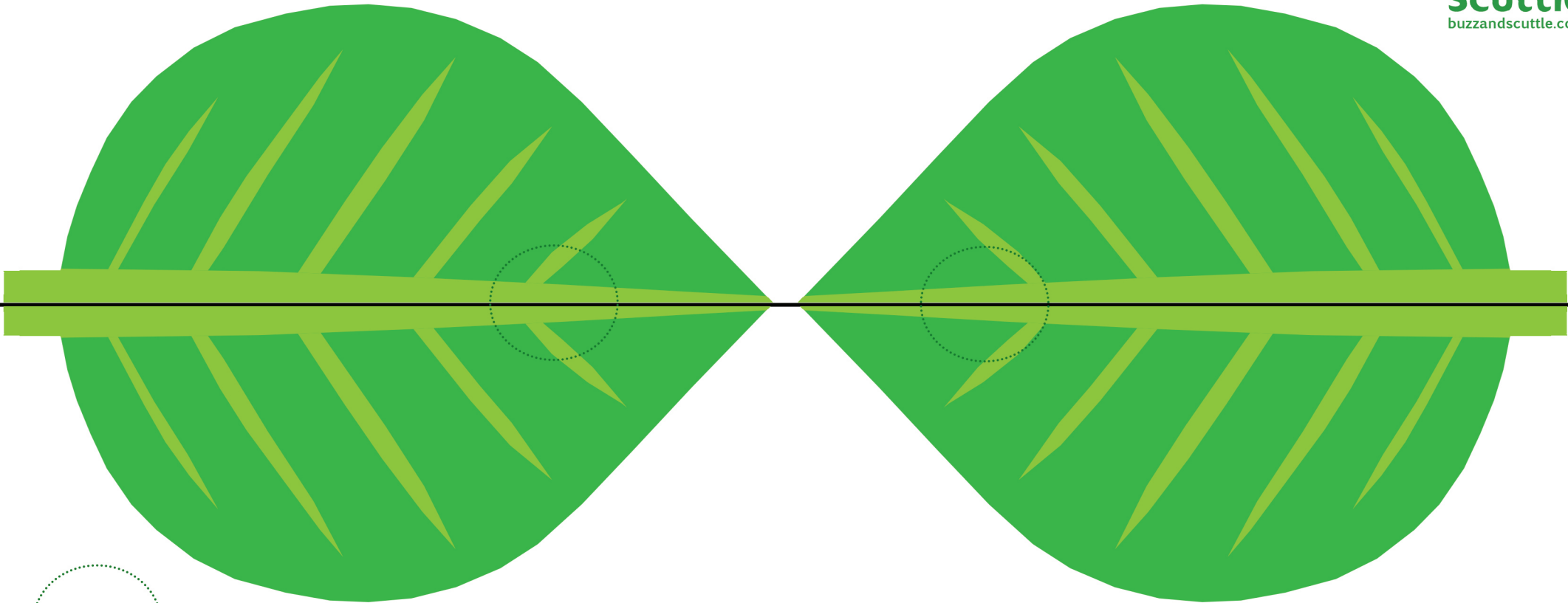
Connect each creature to the food they eat with a line. Look how all the lines make a food web and how the wild creatures in our gardens and parks depend on each other for food.

- 1) Garden Spiders eat: Ladybirds, soldier beetles, wasps, aphids
 2) Snails eat: green leaves
 3) Earthworms eat: soil/greenwaste
 4) Ladybirds eat: Aphids
 5) Beetle grubs eat: soil/greenwaste
 6) Soldier Beetles eat: Snails, aphids, pollen and nectar
 7) Wasps eat: Pollen and nectar, aphids, Smooth Snail Hunter beetles, ladybirds
 8) Smooth Snail Hunters Beetles eat: Snails
 10) Aphids eat: Green Leaves
 12) Song thrushes eat: Snails, earthworms, soldier beetles, Smooth Snail Hunter Beetles, Beetle grubs, aphids
 14) Hedgehogs eat: Snails, earthworms, ladybirds, beetle grubs, soldier beetles, Smooth Snail Hunter beetles, aphids



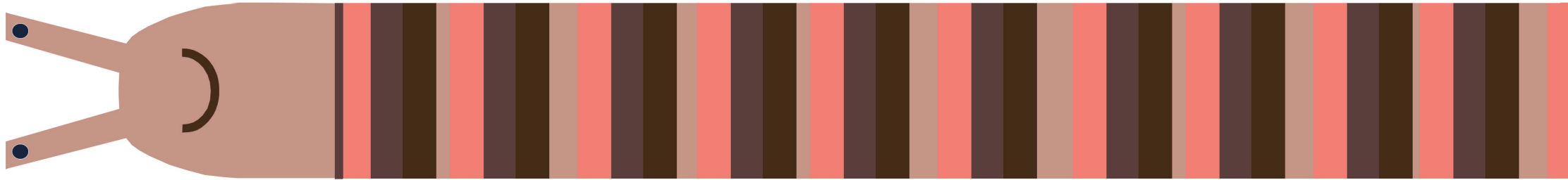
1- Fold the sheet of paper in half down the dark line and then cut out the leaf shapes

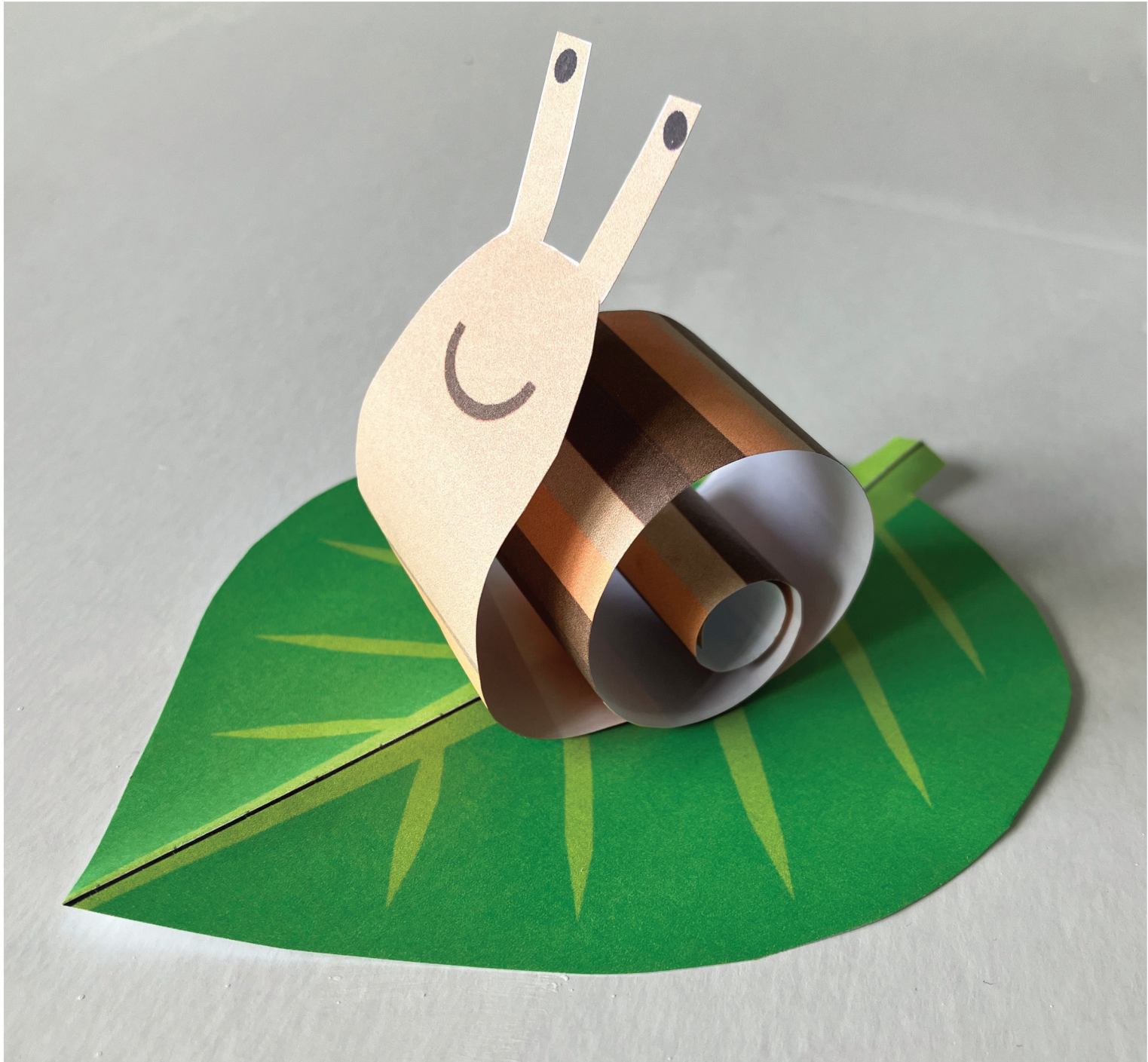
Put this papercraft model together to show how snails love to eat green leaves.



2- Cut a hole in the leaf marked by the dotted lines

3- Cut around the snail and then roll tightly around a pencil from this end.
4- Then glue the snail to the leaf by the underside of its shell.
